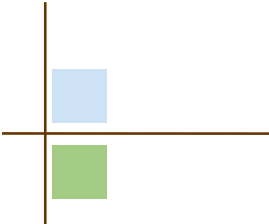
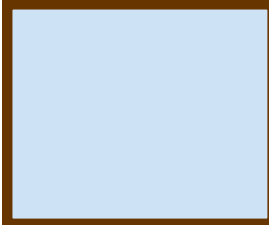

2007 High School Program Overview

Summer school courses for high school credit are offered at Waubonsee Community College. In these courses, experienced high school teachers cover curriculum that has been agreed upon by college district high schools. The amount of credit students receive for the courses is the decision of the home high school.

- Through this program, students have four enrollment options:
 1. One-semester courses, which meet from June 26 to August 1.
 2. Two-semester (full year) courses, which meet from June 26 to August 1.
 3. Condensed two-and-one-half week semester courses, which meet either June 26 to July 13 or July 16 to August 1.
 4. Two-semester (full year) slower-paced course (Algebra I, which meets June 12-August 1.) Instruction will be provided by both a teacher and an aide for those needing additional assistance.

- Registration is from March 5 to June 25, 2007. All fees are due at time of registration. Students and parents please review program guidelines and expectations (pp. 6-7).

Course costs are:

Cost - \$150 per one-semester course or \$300 per two-semester (full year) course

Some courses require additional fees, as indicated on the course schedule.

Refunds will not be granted after June 26

- Courses meet Monday through Friday, excluding Wednesday, July 4. Attendance at all course meetings is mandatory. Transportation is the responsibility of the student. Room assignments will accompany registration confirmation which will be sent to the home address.

- Courses are offered at Sugar Grove Campus, Aurora Campus, Copley Campus and additional extension sites as indicated on course schedule.

English 101* First-Year Composition I

This course focuses on the writing and revising of expository essays and writing projects. Practice in critical thinking and essay development is emphasized. Prereq: Placement determined by assessment score.

Math 101* College Mathematics

The emphasis of the course is on understanding logical arguments, doing abstract thinking and solving verbal problems. Topics covered include logical statements and arguments, geometry in problem solving, estimation, approximation, judging reasonableness of answers, problem solving and statistics. Prereq: Placement determined by assessment score.

Physics 103 Concepts of Physics

A brief survey of the principles of physics, concentrating on the analysis of physical phenomena encountered in everyday experience, but also giving some limited attention to the more abstract realms of quantum physics and relativity. NOTE: Students enrolling in PHY 103 must enroll in PHY 104. Concurrent enrollment required.

Philosophy 110 Introduction to Critical Thinking

This course studies the practical uses of critical reasoning in personal and societal situations. Areas of emphasis include: analysis, construction, evaluation and refutation of deductive and inductive arguments, problem solving, dialogue and debate strategies.

Astronomy 100 Introduction to Astronomy (in the NEW Science Building)

This course is a descriptive, nonmathematical, nonlaboratory survey course in astronomy; some basic arithmetic may be required. Topics include earth and sky, the structure and evolution of the solar system, stars, galaxies and the universe.

Important Student and Parent Information

1. Attendance:

- Attendance is mandatory. A student is allowed two absences per semester. An absence is missing more than 25 percent of a class period. All students are DROPPED upon the third absence in each course.
- Three tardies are equal to one absence.
- Because there are no detentions, failure to comply with rules may result in a behavioral tardy/absence.

2. Behavioral Policy:

- Each student is responsible for knowledge of and compliance with the Code of Student Conduct. Copies will be distributed to students on first day of course. Violations may result in suspension.
- Smoking is not allowed inside the buildings or on the campus grounds.
- NO electronic devices (cell phones, iPods, etc.) or other disruptive items allowed in the classroom.
- Mature behavior is required during breaks as well as in the classroom. Fighting will result in an immediate suspension.
- NO food or drinks are to be taken out of the lounge areas and into the classrooms.
- All Waubensee campuses are drug, alcohol and gun-free zones. Possession of these items on Waubensee property is strictly forbidden. Violation of policies may result in suspension, expulsion or arrest.
- Students are discouraged from wearing specific clothing or displaying gestures that could be associated with gang affiliation. Such displays will not be tolerated.

3. Parking Cars:

Students may park in any legal parking space. Grades are held if parking fines are not paid. At the Aurora Campus, students may park at the Stolp Island garage at a discounted rate. Parking ticket stubs must be validated at the front desk of Aurora Campus to obtain this discount.

4. Textbooks:

- Textbook(s) must be returned to the teacher. Fines are levied for damaged or lost books. Grades will be held until fines are paid. Textbooks are provided in the cost of the course, except where otherwise noted.

5. Financial Obligations:

- All financial obligations must be met before grades are issued. Refunds will not be granted after June 26.
