COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course provides the foundation for developing concepts, attitudes, and philosophies about business operations. The following topics are introduced: management, marketing, finance, economics, ethics and social responsibility, human resources, advertising and promotion, distribution, and international business.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Distinguish between the differing forms of economic systems.
2. Identify the major forms of business organizations.
3. Discuss the differences between sole proprietorship, partnership, and corporation.
4. Discuss the ethical and social responsibilities of business.
5. Discuss management and leadership styles.
6. Identify appropriate human relations and motivation practices from various management scenarios.
7. Compare and contrast labor-management practices.
8. Identify appropriate product and pricing strategies for various scenarios.

TEXTBOOK: A textbook is required and is available from Waubonsee's Bookstores at either the Sugar Grove or the Aurora campus.

TEXT: Understanding Business, Nickels, McHugh, McHugh (McGraw-Hill), 8th edition.

When you purchase your textbook through Waubonsee's bookstore, either online or on campus, your course videos will accompany it. If you choose to obtain your textbook through another source, you will need to obtain access to the videos through the publisher's website:

Tests will be available [May 27](#) at Waubonsee Assessment Services either at the Sugar Grove campus, Collins Hall (first floor-Room 137), or at the Aurora campus, (first-floor-Room 110). You will be asked to submit a photo ID and to leave your textbooks, notes, handbag, etc. at the front desk while taking the test. The tests should be taken prior to moving onto the next section. Your test results may be viewed immediately upon completion of each test.

Welcome to the course "Introduction to Business." For many of you this will be the first time you have taken an independent study course. This course was designed to allow students to earn college credit by fitting the course into their busy schedules.
