Dual Degree Program



The Dual Degree Program (DDP), a unique partnership between Governors State University and eleven Chicagoland community colleges, provides full-time students in the **nursing program at WCC** with an excellent pathway to earn quality, accessible, affordable associate and bachelor's degrees in nursing.

What are the benefits?

- You will be well prepared to apply for admission to GSU's online RN to BSN program, and if you are accepted, you will transfer seamlessly to complete your bachelor's degree. The RN to BSN program accepts up to 85 credit hours in transfer.
- Your **tuition at GSU will be frozen** effective the semester you join the DDP. GSU, through the DDP program, gives community college students the advantage of a Guaranteed Tuition Plan, which is typically reserved for students who spend all four years at a university. GSU offers an exceptional education at an afforable tuition rate.
- If you are Pell-eligible, you can compete for one of fifty GSU Promise Scholarships, which will cover tuition, fees, and books at GSU. If you are not Pell-eligible, but you are still in need of financial assistance, you can compete for one of thirteen DDP Honors Scholarships, which will cover tuition and fees.
- Jessica Specht, the primary GSU DDP contact for students at WCC, will help you with a plan to complete your associate and bachelor's degrees in nursing, so that you won't lose credits when you transfer.

How does it work?

Students in the WCC nursing program are uniquely qualified for the DDP. To be accepted, apply after you have successfully completed your first semester in the nursing program. Visit our DDP web page and select WCC to download the application. Fill it out and return the application to Jessica Specht*. Jessica will verify your eligibility and soon thereafter you will get a letter welcoming you to the Dual Degree Program.

Once I've been accepted into the DDP program, what do I have to do?

The requirements are quite simple, but very important:

- Continue to enroll in and graduate from the nursing program at WCC.
- Communicate with Jessica Specht at least once per semester.
- Plan to attend a DDP induction program (details to follow).
- Apply for admission to the GSU online RN-BSN program.
