What is a College Major?

A specific area of study that requires a group of courses selected by the college in order to receive a degree. College majors often prepare students to embark on a career in that specified field of study.

The specific area of study will help students prepare to enter a career path. Some examples are Nursing and Education, among others.



A College Major IS NOT:

- Your Identity
- ONE and DONE Career Path
- What OTHERS THINK you should be/study



What is an Academic Degree?

An academic degree is a qualification awarded to students upon successful completion of a course of study in higher education, usually at a college or university.

Examples:

- Certificates (less than 2 years)
- Associates (2 years)
- Bachelors (4 years)
- Masters (2-3 years)



Career and Degree Options at WCC

Occupational (AAS, Certificate)

- Prepare students for specific careers/occupations
- Learn specific technical skills needed for future career options
- Ex., Accounting, Automotive Technology, Welding, Computer Information Systems, Criminal Justice

Transfer

- Take courses in a wide variety of subjects
- Gaining surface knowledge in several areas of study, but not technical skill focused
- Range of career / degree options




