

Medical Assistant Certificate of Achievement Program Application Packet

The Medical Assistant Certificate Program at Waubonsee Community is approved by the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB), the Illinois State Board of Higher Education, and the U.S. Department of Education. The program is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA), as well as by the Commission on A ccreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP), and the Medical Assisting Education Review Board (MAERB).

Graduates of the program who meet CAAHEP requirements are eligible to take the national certification exam for Certified Medical Assistants through the American Association of Medical Assistants (AAMA). Students who meet American Society of Clinical Pathologists (ASCP) requirements will be eligible to take the national certification exam for Phlebotomy Technician, PBT (ASCP).
