Christoffel Brothers Reflect on Career Success Since Graduating from Waubonsee's Automotive Technology Program

Waubonsee alumni Joe and Dan Christoffel, of Oswego, have a unique bond that sets them apart from typical siblings. Despite being ten years apart in age and in their academic journeys, they have followed almost identical paths leading to successful careers. Both brothers have excelled in their professional careers at Navistar Inc., working in separate cubicles rows apart. They attribute their success in the industry to their experiences at Waubonsee, recognizing the college's significant role in shaping their careers.

"I wasn't originally thinking about earning a bachelor's degree. I think about how Guy pushed me to transfer to SIU after Waubonsee, and I'm so grateful he did," said Joe. "Looking back, I

was able to make the decision to go to SIU and influence Dan to have a successful full-time career at Navistar."

"I just felt like I belonged, I felt like we as a collective group were struggling with the complexities of the undergrad nursing program and all that comes with that. It made us feel like a community," Daniels said.

Waubonsee honors HOF inductees and 2022-23 Student-Athletes

Waubonsee Community College held its Annual Athletic Banquet and Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony on May 18. Haley (Kilbride) Jochim, a women's soccer All-American for Waubonsee in 2014; John Sudges, a standout Chiefs' baseball player and fastpitch softball National Champion; and Perry Clark, the winningest softball coach in Waubonsee history, were all formally enshrined into the college's Hall of Fame.

In addition, Waubonsee student-athletes from the 2022-2023 school year were recognized during the evening for their accomplishments. All-American basketball player Joey Niesman was honored as Sophomore Male Athlete of the Year, with record-setting basketball player Brooke Heiman was named the Sophomore Female Athlete of the Year. Baseball player Matt Bivens was selected the Freshman Male Athlete of the Year, while two-sport athlete Emily Hurst was unanimously chosen the Freshman Female Athlete of the Year. Softball player Taylor Warren was chosen the Vermillion and Gold Award winner, and baseball player Chazz Crook was the S.T.A.R. Award recipient.




Waubonsee has a Community Garden
