




Figure 1: Shows ZIP Code population as a proportion of the entire Waubonsee district. The 2025 district population estimate was 431,940 people. The 10 most populated communities are shown in red and represent 80.6% of the district total. Yorkville (60560) replaces Geneva (60134) as the 6th highest populated community in the 2025 report.




Figure 2: This chart shows the percentage that each ZIP Code makes up of Fall 2024 in-district credit enrollment (excludes noncredit and Adult Education). Again, the top 10 in this category are shown with a red bar color and represent 82.8% of the district Fall 2024 credit enrollment. As you can see, Figures 1 and 2 are similar, but not the same. The location on the list of Aurora 60504 and 60502 fall in ranking between Figures 1 and 2, while Plano joins the top enrollment locations in Figure 2.





Figure 3: In theory, the percentage of credit student enrollment from a ZIP Code should approximate the percentage of the Waubonsee population that it makes up – that is, the expected difference between population and credit enrollment percentage should be small.

Aurora 60504 and 60502, Geneva and Batavia show significantly lower than expected Fall 2024 credit student enrollment given their 2025 estimated population, while Aurora 60506 and 60505, Montgomery and Oswego show significantly higher than expected credit student enrollment.




Figure 4: Illustrates the percentage of households in a particular ZIP Code as a percentage of all Waubonsee district households – estimated to be 151,103 households in 2025. The 10 most populated communities by household are highlighted in red and represent 80.1% of the district

The Waubonsee district has shown an estimated 5-year household growth rate between 2020 and 2025 of 2.5% (0.5% annual household growth rate).







Figure 5: Illustrates the 2025 estimated race/ethnicity distribution of the district compared to the same distribution of Waubonsee credit students in Fall 2024 (End of Term). The 'All Other' category includes those identified as American Indian/Alaskan Native, Pacific Islander, Multiethnic, other race/ethnicity, and unknown/prefer not to respond. In-district representation of Hispanic/Latinx residents (30.2%) is lower than representation of this race/ethnicity subgroup in the Fall 2024 student population (45.3%).



The figure below shows the relative distribution of Hispanic/Latinx residents across the district compared to the district average of 30.2% (shown as the vertical axis, or zero).




There is a higher-than-average concentration of Hispanic/Latinx residents in Aurora 60505 and Aurora 60506. The concentration of Hispanic/Latinx residents varies greatly across the district, with lower non-white representation seen predominantly in communities west of Route 47 (except Plano). If you excluded the 60505 and 60506 Aurora ZIP Codes from the District total, White residents would make up 61.7% of the overall total, and Hispanic/Latinx residents would be represented at 19.2% overall (an 11.0% decrease from the district average).

- Labor force in this report is defined as those 16 years and over willing and able to work. It includes the employed (civilian or armed forces) plus the unemployed but excludes people who are institutionalized or who choose not to work for a registered business. The 2025 estimate for the district labor force is 243,588 members.
- A person is considered employed when he/she holds a full- or part-time position with a registered employer or is self-employed.
- The unemployment rate is the percentage of the total unemployed labor force actively seeking employment and willing to work. Unemployment may be due to:
 - unique catastrophic local or global crises
 - o cyclical economic fluctuations
 - seasonal changes, such as the decrease in the number of construction jobs during winter
 - structural changes to businesses and occupations, where a business may be reorganizing its workforce or where workers need to re-tool their skill set to compete in the workforce
 - termination of employment
- Unemployment rate may understate actual unemployment due to:
 - Under-employed workers are not counted as unemployed
 - Disillusioned workers not seeking employment are no longer in the unemployment calculation




Figure 7: Shows 2025 residents 16+ and unemployment percentage for communities with labor forces of at least 5,000. The 2025 district average unemployment rate was 4.18%. Higher-than-average unemployment rates were seen in Aurora (60505 & 60506) and Plano (60545). Lower-than-average unemployment rates were seen in Elburn (60119), Oswego (60543), Sugar Grove (60554), Aurora (60503), and Yorkville (60560).




Figure 9: This figure shows the 5 occupations employing the most in-district residents overall (2025 estimate). Top 5 varies across ZIP Codes.




Figure 10: The district average for residents working in White Collar jobs is 61.8%. Aurora (60505) and Sandwich (60548) have significantly fewer residents working in a white-collar occupation than the district average; while Geneva and some Aurora ZIP (60502 and 60503) residents are more likely to work in a white-collar job than the district average. Aurora (60505) residents are 17.5% more likely than the district average (23.0%) to work in a blue-collar occupation.

Figure 10 shows occupational classification groups designated as White Collar, Blue Collar and Service/Farming, for the top 10 communities with at least 5,000 residents employed that have at least one classification group differing from the district average. White collar occupations tend to have higher educational expectations and wages than other classifications.

Figure 11: This chart shows annual median district household income ranges. For the 2025 estimate, Waubonsee's district median income is \$108,042.





Figure 12: Five communities have significantly higher annual household median income levels than the district overall in the 2025 estimate. Aurora (60503) move into the top five this year, pushing Batavia (60510) off of the list. The 2025 household median income is higher by \$8,177 this year. Geneva (60134) continues to have the highest household median income in district, followed by Aurora (60502). These communities are in the northeast portion of our district. Only 15.9% of district households make \$200,000 or more annually – compared to an average of 26.0% in these more affluent communities.






Figure 13: East Aurora (60505, 20.9%) and West Aurora (60506, 19.7%) have significantly higher percentages of households with an annual income below \$35,000 compared to the district average of 13.3%. Statistics from the 2024 Illinois Report Card show that 70.0% of high school students in the East Aurora high school district qualify as low-income (eligible to receive free or reduced-price lunches, live in substitute care, or whose families receive public aid) compared to the state average of 49.8%.




Figure 14: This is an overview of the educational level of all Waubonsee district residents over 25 (estimated 25+ total population = 287,427). The observed percent of education less than HS is greatly influenced by our two largest communities, Aurora 60505 and 60506. If those two ZIPs were excluded, the 'less than HS' percentage for the district would be 6.3% instead of 11.3%.




Figure 15: Residents in the above communities are significantly more likely to hold a Bachelor's or higher degree than the district average for large communities (37.6%). Geneva (60134) continues in the top spot as the 'most educated' district community this year as measured by the 'Total Bachelor's+' category. The lower threshold for inclusion in this chart was 54.3% of residents over 25 in the 'Bachelor's+' category, slightly higher than last year's threshold of 52.6%







Figure 16: The above chart shows two bordering communities in Aurora (60505 & 60506) with a significantly higher than average percent of residents with low educational attainment compared to the district average. The district average percent of residents with an education level less than a High School diploma is 11.3%. 36.4% of Aurora 60505 and 17.3% of Aurora 60506 residents over 25 have less than a HS education compared to the district-average of 11.3%.




Percent of Population that is Hispanic/Latino, 2025

Percent of Population that has not Completed High School, 2025




ZIP Code-level Demographic Points of Interest

- The Asian population in 60502 (29%) is more than 4 times that of the district (7%). The Hispanic/Latinx (14%) residents are about half of the district average (30%).
- 60% of residents of 60502 earned a Bachelor's degree or higher (22% higher than the district at 38%), and twice as likely to have a Master's degree compared to the district.
- Annual Household Income is higher in 60502 (\$135k) than the district average (\$108K), second only to Geneva (\$137K) in wealth as measured by Annual Household Income.
- The percentage of residents of 60502 in white collar jobs is 16% higher than that of the district. Computer/Mathematical occupation class is in the top 5 for 60502, but not for the district.

Big Rock, IL - ZIP Code 60511





Fall 2024 Enrollment by Campus Location



Bristol, IL - ZIP Code 60512





Elburn, IL - ZIP Code 60119







Montgomery, IL - ZIP Code 60538





Oswego, IL - ZIP Code 60543





Plano, IL - ZIP Code 60545







Somonauk, IL - ZIP Code 60552





Sugar Grove, IL - ZIP Code 60554





Yorkville, IL - ZIP Code 60560




