Kicking Off the Spring Semester with RISE Real Talk and a Stellar Start for Students

It is always an honor to officially kick off the spring semester with my All-College Address. This semester, as we near the one-year anniversary of our official internal RISE 2030 launch, I spent some time addressing “Real Talk” about the plan, now that we’ve moved from strategy to implementation. I also gave examples of the “Real Work” and “Real Impact” already demonstrated through the plan.

Connecting Campuses, Expanding Opportunities

Wauboonsee helps local community residents travel the road to success. But what happens to those individuals who are literally unable to get on that road – when a lack of transportation limits their opportunities? This semester, the college launches a new solution to that problem – [a free shuttle service between Wauboonsee’s Sugar Grove and Aurora Downtown Campuses.](#)

In a recent survey of WCC students, more than one-third said they lacked a reliable mode of transportation, with 80 percent saying they would be interested in a shuttle between campuses. We listened and responded with a service that runs Monday-Thursday mornings and afternoons, opening up more academic and career opportunities to our students.





Easing Students' Local Transfer Pathways

Waubonsee students benefit not only from the high-quality higher education here, but also from the many four-year college and university options in the area. With its location in the heart of our district, we're pleased to continue strengthening our partnership with Aurora University through a new Early Interest/Admission agreement.

AU is already a top transfer destination for WCC students, with nearly 300 WCC students transferring to AU to continue their education every year.

Building on the guaranteed admission agreement currently in place, this new program will benefit students through early academic planning, coordinated advising, transitional support, and eligibility for specific AU scholarships and student services.

I am happy to get the opportunity to attend The American Association of Colleges and Universities annual meeting in DC this month, with the theme, "Answering the Call for Constructive Engagement."
