

NAS 101 **Fact Sheet**



- Meet the minimum age requirement – 16 years of age.
- Meet the Reading Requirement – participants must speak and read English, and have at least an 8th grade reading level.
- Complete a fingerprinting background check for the IDPH Health Care Worker Registry – fingerprinting has to be done in Illinois for this process.
- Meet the Health Requirements.
- The NAS 101 class is a combination of classroom theory, laboratory skills practice, and clinicals conducted at area Long Term Care Facilities (all students must have their own transportation to the clinical sites). Classes are conducted at Aurora Fox Valley, Aurora Downtown and Plano Campuses. The NAS 101 course **REQUIRES MANDATORY ATTENDANCE ON THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS AND THE FIRST DAY OF CLINICAL**. Students who fail to attend the first class or clinical day will not be allowed to continue in the course. In addition, students who fail to meet the state required attendance throughout the course will not be allowed to continue in the course. Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be eligible to take the state mandated written competency examination for Nurse Assistant Certification.
