What is a College Major?

A specific area of study that requires a group of courses selected by the college in order to receive a degree.

College majors often prepare students to embark on a career in that specified field of study.

- reer path
- ONE and DONE Career path
- What OTHERS THINK you should study/be



What is a Career?

A career can be defined as: An occupation or vocational trade that one undertakes for a significant amount of time in a specific area of interest.





What is a College Degree?

A qualification that is awarded to students after successful completion of a specific course of study in post-secondary education. Certificate | Associate | Bachelors

Career and Degree Options at WCC

Occupational (AAS, Certificate)

- Prepare students for specific careers/occupations
- Learn specific technical skills needed for future career options
- Ex., Accounting, Automotive Technology, Welding, Computer Information Systems, Nursing, etc.

Transfer

- Take courses in a wide variety of subjects
- Gaining surface knowledge in several areas of study, but not technical skill focused
- Range of career / degree options

Choose Your Major Based On Your Favorite Subject

- This is a good starting point, focusing on interests, but..
