


# Welcome to our High School Equivalency Program!

#### Reminder: Free Parking Available Near Campus



- At the Aurora Downtown Campus, students may park in Lot W at 309 N. River St.

#### **Class Information**

8-week classes begin the week of January 19, 2021 (SPACE LIMITED - DEPENDS ON CLASS LEVEL)

12-week classes begin the week of February 15, 2021 (SPACE LIMITED - DEPENDS ON CLASS LEVEL)

8-week classes begin the week of March 22, 2021



#### **Class Times**

- Morning classes meet 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.
- Evening classes meet 6 to 9 p.m.
  - \*\*These times may be different for online classes



# **Class Options**

#### **Hybrid Classes**

These classes meet in-person at the Downtown Aurora campus 1 day each week for 3 hours and require an additional 3 hours of at-home/online assignments.

#### **In-Person Meeting Days:**

Math Classes: Wednesdays

Language Arts: Tuesdays or Thursdays

#### **100% Online Classes**

These classes meet online via Zoom 1 or 2 times each week. There will also be at-home/online assignments for a total time commitment of 6 hours each week.




# **Attendance Policy**


- You must attend the first day to enroll.

- You will need a pen/pencil, notebook and folder.








# **Technology Requirements**

- We will give you access to the required educational software






# Plan to Attend Technology Class

- Attend a Zoom meeting







# Pathway Through Adult Education HSE/GED



- After each 8-week class, students may advance a level, repeat the same level or be ready to pass the official HSE exams
- Students that test into HSE020 or higher are also eligible to take a math class.

#### **Earning your HSE Certificate**

- Waubonsee is a testing center for the GED® test as well as the TASC® test.
- Waubonsee's assessment office is located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Downtown Aurora campus
- \*\*In-Person testing is limited due to COVID-19, but some testing companies allow students to test at home if certain eligibility and technology capabilities are met.



#### The GED® Test

- You should be 18 years old to take the test.
- If you are 17 and taking Adult Education classes, your separation letter can be sent to the state.
   They must approve your request in order to take the test before you are 18
- You must live in Illinois.



#### The GED® Test

 There are five separate tests you must pass in order to be granted an HSE certificate in Illinois:

Language Arts

Social Studies

Science

Math

**Constitution Test** 



#### **GED®** Practice Tests

- Practice tests are available from the GED®
   Testing Service in each subject.
  - Half the length of the operational test
  - 92% success rate in predicting if you are ready
  - Include strategic study guides



#### Costs

- Our classes are FREE
- \$30 for each GED test, \$120 total
  - Can be scheduled and paid for one at a time.
- Constitution test is FREE
- GED Ready practice tests are \$6 each, \$24 total
- \*\*\*Current GED.com discount code: **ILSAVE20**brings cost for each test to \$10/each



# What Are My Next Steps?

- Your transition advisor will be contacting you to discuss the results of your placement test and answer any questions you have.
- You will receive an invitation to a required 2-hour technology class that you need to attend before your class starts.
- Your instructor will contact you sometime the week before classes start to tell you more about your class.
- You need to be sure you attend your first day of class!
