General Testing Guidelines:

- ACCUPLACER, ACT, SAT, GED, and HiSET scores are valid for three years from the date of testing. High School GPA is valid for three years from the date of graduation. Visit www.waubonsee.edu/placement for additional expiration terms.
- ACCUPLACER Retests: **You may try three times** within a three-year period. The highest score will be used for course placement. The **first try** is free. Be sure to study and come prepared for the test. The **second try** is free. You must wait 24 hours after your first test and spend time studying before retaking. The **third try** has a \$15 fee. You must wait seven days after your second test and study before this final attempt. Placement scores are valid for three years.
