Teams of five students from participating schools compete to diagnose and repair complex automotive problems during a three-hour competition. Six local high school and career center programs, Oswego East High School, Oswego High School, Indian Valley Vocational Center, East Aurora High School, West Aurora High School, and Fox Valley Career Center competed for the coveted WCC/VALEES Skills Traveling Trophy. This year, students from Oswego East High School were crowned the champions under their instructor Jake Evans.

On March 8, Dr. Melinda Tejada facilitated judging of the John J. Swalec, Jr. President's Achievement Awards. The distinguished panel of judges included Yonas Hagos, Entrepreneur Yorkville Dunkin Donuts/Baskin Robbins Franchisee; Julio A. Macias, Executive Director at Covenant Living Communities and Services in Batavia; Wamecca Rodriguez, Library Media Specialist at Yorkville CUSD #115; and Brian Schmidt, Chief Operator Officer at Deep Coat Industries LLC in Sugar Grove.

On March 9, Business, Technology and Workforce Education (BTWE) hosted the BTWE Open House and CTE Signing Day in Akerlow and Weigel Halls. This annual event organized by the Automotive Technology Faculty is an opportunity for prospective students to tour Waubonsee CTE lab spaces, meet program instructors, and connect with employers in the industry. CTE programs that participated include: Automotive Technology, Auto Body Repair, Automation Technology, Computer Aided Design and Drafting, Cybersecurity, HVAC, Machine Tool Technology, and Welding Technology.
