


Figure 1: Shows ZIP Code population as a proportion of the entire Waubonsee district. The 2023 district population estimate was 428,180 people. The 10 most populated communities are shown in red and represent 80.7% of the district total.

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


Figure 2: This chart shows the percentage that each ZIP Code makes up of Fall 2022 in-district credit enrollment (excludes noncredit and Adult Education). As you can see, Figures 1 and 2 are similar, but not the same.





Figure 3: In theory, the percentage of credit student enrollment from a ZIP Code should approximate the percentage of the Waubonsee population that it makes up – that is, the expected difference between population and credit enrollment percentage should be small.

Aurora 60504 and 60502 (DuPage) show significantly lower than expected Fall 2022 credit student enrollment given their 2023 estimated population. Not many credit students enrolled in Fall 2022 from either of these ZIP Codes (N = 185 and N = 54, respectively)




Figure 4: Illustrates the percentage of households in a particular ZIP Code as a percentage of all Waubonsee district households – estimated to be 149,084 households in 2023. The 10 most populated communities by household are highlighted in red and represent 80.1% of the district

At the ZIP Code level, the Waubonsee district as a whole has shown an estimated 3-year household growth rate between 2020 and 2023 of 1.04% (0.34% annual household growth rate). Two-thirds of ZIP Codes are expected to fall within the range of -0.81% to 2.92% for their 3-year growth rate.







Figure 5: Illustrates the 2023 estimated race/ethnicity distribution of the district compared to the same distribution of Waubonsee credit students in Fall 2022 (IPEDS). The 'All Other' category includes those identified as American Indian/Alaskan Native, Pacific Islander, Multiethnic, other race/ethnicity, and unknown/prefer not to respond.

Note: In-district representation of Hispanic/Latinx residents (29.3%) is lower than representation of this race/ethnicity subgroup in the Fall 2022 student population (41.3%).

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The figure below shows the relative distribution of Hispanic/Latino residents across the district compared to the district average of 29.3% (shown as the vertical axis, or zero).




Note: There is a higher than average concentration of Hispanic/Latinx residents in both Aurora 60505 and Aurora 60506. The concentration of Hispanic/Latinx residents varies greatly across the district, with lower non-white representation seen predominantly in communities west of Route 47 (with the exception of Plano). If you were to exclude the 60505 and 60506 Aurora ZIP Codes from the District total, White residents would make up 63.7% of the overall total, and Hispanic/Latinx residents would be represented at 18.0% overall (an 11.3% decrease).

- The "labor force" may be defined as all citizens over 16 years old who are willing and able to work. It 0 includes the employed (civilian or armed forces) plus the unemployed. This number excludes people who are institutionalized or who choose not to work for a registered business. The 2023 estimate for the district labor force is 227,594 members.
- A person is considered "employed" when he/she holds a full- or part-time position with a registered employer or is self-employed.
- The unemployment rate is the percentage of the total labor force that is unemployed but is actively 0 seeking employment and is willing to work. Unemployment may be due to:
 - unique catastrophic local or global crises (such as the recent pandemic)
 - cyclical economic fluctuations, like the pending recession 0
 - seasonal changes, such as the decrease in the number of construction jobs during winter
 - structural changes to businesses and occupations, where a business may be reorganizing its workforce, or where workers need to "re-tool" their skill set to compete in the workforce
 - termination of employment
- 'Unemployment rate' may understate actual unemployment due to:
 - Under-employed workers are not counted as unemployed
 - "Disillusioned workers" who have stopped seeking employment are no longer in the unemployment calculation.




Figure 7: Shows 2023 residents employed and unemployment percentage for in-district 'large' communities (labor force of at least 5,000 residents). The 2023 district unemployment rate for large communities was 4.0%. Higher than average unemployment rates were seen in Plano (60545), and East Aurora (60505). Lower than average unemployment rates were seen in Elburn (60119), Sugar Grove (60554) and Oswego (60543).

Figure 8: The table on the previous pages looks at a combination of overall ranking, 2023-2028 job change, median hourly earnings and employment concentration. Three occupations are on the top of the list: Heating, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration Mechanics and Installers, Heavy and Tractor-Trailer Truck Drivers, and Medical Assistants. Waubonsee had 2021 completions in two of these three "top" areas.

Employment Concentration = a metric indicating relative concentration in a local geography compared to the national concentration. A value of 1.0 would mean that the local occupation concentration equals the national concentration. The higher the value, the higher the local occupation concentration.




Figure 9: This figure shows the 5 occupations employing the most in-district residents. Top 5 varies across ZIP Codes.

White collar occupations tend to have higher educational expectations and wages than other classifications.




Figure 10: The district average for residents working in White Collar jobs is 61.4%. Aurora 60505 and Sandwich have significantly fewer residents working in a white-collar occupation than the district average; while Geneva and some Aurora ZIP Codes (60502 and 60503) residents are more likely to work in a white-collar job than the district average. Aurora (60505) residents are 19% more likely than the district average (22.8%) to work in a blue-collar occupation.




Figure 11: This chart shows annual median district household income ranges. For the 2023 estimate, Waubonsee's district median income is \$104,066.




Figure 12: Only two communities have significantly higher annual median household income levels than the district overall in the 2023 estimate. Geneva (60134) has the highest annual median income in our district, followed closely by Aurora (60502). These communities are in the northeast portion of our district. Only 14.5% of district households make \$200,000 or more annually.









Figure 13: East Aurora (60505, 25.8%), West Aurora (60506, 22.1%) and Sandwich (60548, 16.0%) have a significantly higher percentage of households with an annual income below \$35,000 - compared to the district average of 14.1%. Statistics from the 2022 Illinois Report Card show that 66.5% of high school students in the East Aurora high school district qualify as low-income (eligible to receive free or reduced-price lunches, live in substitute care, or whose families receive public aid) compared to the state average of 46.5%.




Figure 14: This is an overview of the educational level of all Waubonsee district residents over 25 (estimated 25+ total population = 279,965). Note: Observed percent of education less than HS is greatly influenced by our two largest communities, Aurora 60505 and 60506. If those two ZIPs were excluded, the 'less than HS' percentage for the district would be 6.8% instead of 12.3%




Figure 15: Residents in the above communities are significantly more likely to hold a Bachelor's or higher degree than the district average (36.8%). Geneva (60134) continues in the top spot as the 'most educated' district community this year as measured by the 'Total Bachelor's+' category. The lower threshold for inclusion in this chart was 50.4% of residents over 25 in the 'Bachelor's+' category, slightly higher than last year's threshold of 49.3%







Figure 16: The above chart shows a single community in Aurora (60505) with a significantly higher than average percent of residents with low educational attainment compared to the district average. The district average percent of residents with an education level less than a High School diploma is 12.3%. 39% of Aurora 60505 residents over 25 have less than a HS education. If 60505 data were excluded from the district figures, percentage of in-district residents with less than a High School diploma would decrease to 8.5%.




Percent of Population that is Hispanic/Latino, 2023


Percent of Population that has not Completed High School, 2023




Percent of Population that has not Completed High School, 2023



ZIP Code-level Demographic Points of Interest

- There are a higher percentage of Asian residents in 60502 (27%) than in the district overall (6%).
- A higher percentage (58%) of residents in 60502 have a Bachelor's Degree or higher, compared to the district average (37%).
- A higher percentage (27%) of residents in 60502 have a household income of \$200,000 or more, compared to the district average of 14%. White collar workers (74%) are more prevalent in 60502 than in the district overall (61%).
- In Aurora (60502), a higher than average educational level, coupled with more persons employed in a white-collar job, has resulted in an observed annual
 median income roughly 22% above the district average.

Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location





Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location





Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location





Big Rock, IL - ZIP Code 60511







Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location





Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location



Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location





Oswego, IL - ZIP Code 60543





Plano, IL - ZIP Code 60545





Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location






Fall 2022 Enrollment by Campus Location

Sugar Grove, IL - ZIP Code 60554




