For the 13th consecutive year, Waubonsee has achieved national recognition as a Tree Campus Higher Education institution, a program established in 2008 by the Arbor Day Foundation. To obtain this distinction, Waubonsee met the five core standards for effective campus forest management, including the establishment of a tree advisory committee, evidence of a campus tree care plan, dedicated annual expenditures for its campus tree program, an Arbor Day observance, and the sponsorship of student service-learning projects.
