In other exciting news, Waubonsee has been awarded a \$350,000 National Science Foundation grant. This was a three-year development process for the college and specifically Dr. Sheela Vemu, Associate Professor of Biology, Dr. Nancy Christensen, Associate Professor of Chemistry, and our grants team. This grant will allow us to explore a new program in water treatment and waste water treatment.

Last month, I mentioned an upcoming tour of REVV Aviation. This tour was part of ongoing conversations with Ne'Keisha Stepney and other Waubonsee leaders to explore ways to offer a program that would meet the increasing need for qualified Aviation Maintenance Technicians in the region. A memo documenting workforce needs in this area as well as next steps for this collaboration is included in your Info Items book this month.
