About the Program

The QuickPath program allows for students to obtain their associate degree in a streamlined fashion. The program offers most courses in a hybrid eight-week format, consisting of half the coursework having face-to-face meetings, and the other half delivered through online instruction. In addition, courses are scheduled for the entire year, eliminating the need for changing schedules from semester to semester allowing students to maintain a more consistent school-work-life balance.

Eligibility Requirements

- Possess a high level of commitment and motivation to complete their degree.
- Demonstrate college readiness through a minimum 2.75 high school grade point average. This requirement is waived for students 21 and older.
- Placement into college-level courses. See www.waubonsee.edu/placement for more information.

Program Requirements

- Commit to the selected cohort's schedule for the entire program, which includes fall, spring and summer semesters.
- Maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average throughout the program.
- Meet regularly with the Program Manager.

Steps to Applying

- ❑ Submit a Waubonsee New Student Information Form at www.waubonsee.edu/nsif. Upon submission of the form, you will receive your student ID/X-number for use on this application. If you have already been issued a Waubonsee X-number through dual credit enrollment, you should continue to use it, but a New Student Information Form is still required. If you previously have an X-number for other reasons, please use that number.
- ❑ Complete the attached QuickPath Application Form and submit with the following materials:
 - ✓ Documentation of academic achievement (high school and/or college transcripts, GED®/HSE certificate, relevant test scores, awards and honors, etc.)
 - ✓ One letter of recommendation from someone who can attest to your ability to be successful in this program.
 - ✓ A one- to two-page essay describing why you'll be successful in the QuickPath Degree Program, specifically addressing the hybrid coursework and 8-week course schedule.
 - ✓ Submit your QuickPath Application packet by April 15, 2019 to:
